



## Psalm 85

<sup>1</sup> You, Lord, showed favor to your land;  
you restored the fortunes of Jacob.

<sup>2</sup> You forgave the iniquity of your people  
and covered all their sins.

<sup>3</sup> You set aside all your wrath  
and turned from your fierce anger.

<sup>4</sup> Restore us again, God our Savior,  
and put away your displeasure toward us.

<sup>5</sup> Will you be angry with us forever?  
Will you prolong your anger through all generations?



- <sup>6</sup> Will you not revive us again,  
that your people may rejoice in you?
- <sup>7</sup> Show us your unfailing love, Lord,  
and grant us your salvation.
- <sup>8</sup> I will listen to what God the Lord says;  
he promises peace (*shalom*) to his people, his faithful  
servants—  
but let them not turn to folly.
- <sup>9</sup> Surely his salvation is near those who fear him,  
that his glory may dwell in our land.
- <sup>10</sup> Love and faithfulness meet together;  
righteousness and peace (*shalom*) kiss each other.



- 11 Faithfulness springs forth from the earth,  
and righteousness looks down from heaven.
- 12 The Lord will indeed give what is good,  
and our land will yield its harvest.
- 13 Righteousness goes before him  
and prepares the way for his steps.







## Judges 6

<sup>22</sup> When Gideon realized that it was the angel of the Lord, he exclaimed, “Alas, Sovereign Lord! I have seen the angel of the Lord face to face!”

<sup>23</sup> But the Lord said to him, “Peace! Do not be afraid. You are not going to die.”

<sup>24</sup> So Gideon built an altar to the Lord there and called it The Lord Is Peace.





## Numbers 6

<sup>24</sup>“The Lord bless you and keep you;

<sup>25</sup> the Lord make his face shine on you  
and be gracious to you;

<sup>26</sup> the Lord turn his face toward you  
and give you peace (shalom).”

<sup>27</sup> “So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I  
will bless them.”







## John 14

<sup>25</sup> “All this I have spoken while still with you.

<sup>26</sup> But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you. <sup>27</sup> Peace (*eirēnē*) I leave with you; my peace (*eirēnē*) I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.”



## John 16

<sup>33</sup> “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace (*eirēnē*). In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”



## John 20

<sup>19</sup> On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace (*eirēnē*) be with you!” <sup>20</sup> After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.

<sup>21</sup> Again Jesus said, “Peace (*eirēnē*) be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”

<sup>22</sup> And with that he breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit. <sup>23</sup> If you forgive anyone’s sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.”









## Galatians 5

<sup>22</sup>But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup>gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. <sup>24</sup>Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. <sup>25</sup>Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. <sup>26</sup>Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.
